The myth of stasis

- 103M people are forcibly displaced
- · 53.2M people are internally displaced,
- 32.5M people are refugees
- 5.3M people need international protection
- 4.9M of us are asylum seekers

More than 7 out of 10 people who need International Protection come from just 5 countries:

- Syria
- Venezuela
- Ukraine
- Afghanistan
- South Sudan

Most come with qualifications, including some which partially documented. Everyone has history.

NARIC Ireland has Comparability Statements for qualifications from each of these countries among our total 1500+, and 'Rough Guides' for Ukraine, Syria and Afghanistan*.



Our binding obligations- the Lisbon Recognition Convention

Article VII

• Each Party shall take all feasible and reasonable steps within the framework of its education system and in conformity with its constitutional, legal, and regulatory provisions to develop procedures designed to <u>assess fairly and expeditiously</u> whether refugees, displaced persons and persons in a refugee-like situation <u>fulfil the relevant requirements for access</u> to higher education, to further higher education <u>programmes or to employment activities</u>, <u>even in cases in which the qualifications obtained in one of the Parties cannot be proven through documentary evidence</u>.

2017 Recommendation & Explanatory memorandum

- Qualifications should be recognised unless a <u>substantial difference</u> is shown
- Assessment is an entitlement for access purposes
- The 2010 Revised Recommendation on Criteria and Procedures for the assessment of Foreign Qualifications applies where qualifications cannot be fully documented
- Includes periods of study

Where does Recognition stop and RPL begin?

The 'European Area of Recognition (EAR) Manual' is a set of Guidelines developed by the ENIC NARIC Network to support Credential Evaluators, including with specific chapters on

- Refugees
- Substantial Difference
- Alternative Recognition
- Non-traditional learning (RPL is included under this heading, and treats mainly the recognition of qualifications achieved through RPL)

The underlying orientation, informed by outcomes, is whether the applicant is ready, sufficiently prepared for the desired activity?

Clear gap- experiential, informal learning can be recognised through RPL processes, including RPL for access, exemptions and awards.

Processes supporting recognition where qualifications and other documentation is missing have been developed through two collaborative projects of the ENIC NARIC Network led by NOKUT:

• **ARENA** (ARENA | Nokut)(Borundi, Yemen, Sudan, Palestine, Rwanda)

and

• REACT (REACT – Refugees and Recognition | Nokut) (Iran, Ethiopia, Somalia, Venezuela, DRC)











- The European Qualifications
 Passport for Refugees
- Bologna (2020); new legal instrument -Council of Europe/ MS by end 2023
- Coordinated by the Council of Europe, individual applications directly to them
- Process results in a standardised document outlining educational level, work experience, and language proficiency
- Through a panel-based (2) evaluation process involving a structured interview and assessment of available documentation (background paper)
- Twenty participating Countries, sharing and growing expertise
- Supported by UCD, UL, MTU(Cork), RPL in HE, NARIC Ireland- Training from Jan 2023
